



Emergency Preparedness – Are you Ready?

Be ready for earthquakes or other disasters by having an emergency kit on hand. Here is a checklist of things you need to add to your kit for any disaster.

1. **Extra Cash** - Have one and five dollar bills as well as twenty's. Also some change. Put at least \$300.00 in your kit and bury it down into the middle of the kit so it's not easy to get to. Remember: no debit or ATM's will be available with no electricity.

2. **Pictures of your loved ones**—including your pets. In case you can't find one of them you can ask people if they have seen them.

3. **Prescription Medication** for all members of family.

4. Extra pair of glasses for all members of family.

5. **Extra set of keys** for the house and car. You may have to leave the house in a hurry and not hunting for keys can save you time.

6. **Special items** for infants, elderly, disabled members of family - you may want to add baby formula, baby food, baby Tylenol, Ensure, baby aspirin etc.

7. **Important family information**: Photocopy important key documents, like Insurance Policy #; Phone number of out of state contacts; Credit card info; Checking account info; List of physician and pharmacy (may need prescriptions called in); Pet License; Vet phone #; Animal shelter. Do not rely on these phone numbers being in your cell phone. The cell towers may be down. Also written instructions of feeding schedules, medical conditions, behavior problems in case you must leave your animal at a shelter. You want to write it down now when you are calm rather than when you are rushed. Sometimes in a disaster you can't find a piece of paper to write it down on and everyone is crazy.

8. **Tear out the front of your old yellow pages**/white pages emergency information. This tells you what Radio station to listen to, where to go for shelter.

9. Area Map. Specific to your area showing street names.

10. Extra blanket, sheet, extra clothes.

11. **Hygiene supplies** : Toothbrush, tooth paste, comb, tampon, pads, baby or adult diapers.

12. Pet Supplies: Leash, collar, pet food, bowl.

13. **Book, playing cards**: something to help pass the time and take your mind off things.

14. **Out of State Contact**: Need a contact person from out of state that everyone can call to check in with in a disaster.

15. **Meeting Spot** Outside Home & Outside Neighborhood: Need in case of fire in your home or fire in neighborhood/tsunami and can't get into home community.

16. **Add ICE** (In Case Of Emergency) at the end of the title of your home, spouse's, and children's phone # in your cell phone.
